

Phenomenal hotels

For a unique experience – stay three metres underwater or in a sinking house in Lake Mälaren.

With his vision and creative hotels, artist Mikael Genberg has really put Västerås on the map. Hotel Utter Inn attracts visitors from around the world who want to stay below the surface, as this is a submerged hotel in Västeråsfjärden, just off Västerås harbour. As well as Utter Inn,

a stroll along Lake Mälaren will also give you a glimpse of Ooops Hotel, "the sinking house", which is anchored at Färjkajen. Another of Mikael's works in Västerås is Hotel Hackspett. A tree house hotel located at the top of a mighty oak in Vasaparken.





Castles

There is something magical about castles and there are four to explore around Västerås. They are all very different, and each has a story to tell!

VÄSTERÅS CASTLE

Västerås Castle is situated in central Västerås. The castle received its current appearance in the mid-16th century when it was altered and rebuilt by King Gustav Vasa. Prince Erik XIV, the successor to the throne, was given his own rooms here but little did he know that the castle would become his prison.

TIDÖ CASTLE

One of the best-preserved castles from Sweden's Age of Greatness. Home to the MC Collection and the Bicycle Museum.

STRÖMSHOLMS PALACE

A royal palace in a stunning location on the Strömsholm canal known for it's well-preserved royal interiors and a large art collection.

ENGSÖ CASTLE

Engsö Castle outside Västerås is well worth a visit. Besides being a beautiful building in picturesque surroundings, rumour has it that it is haunted!

This little piece of paradise is set in the middle of Frösåker's beautiful countryside and gives you the opportunity to try out some historic activities like sailing and rowing longboats, play tournament games and learn more about the Viking Age. You can also enjoy refreshments and spend the night in a Viking ship, a boathouse or your own boat in the guest harbour. Frösåkers brygga is home to Sweden's largest floating boat museum with over 20 Viking ships, 2 cogs and a number of traditional boats. An educational Viking adventure for people of all ages is waiting for you at Frösåkers brygga!

ANUNDSHÖG - A FORGOTTEN TIME!

Anundshög is a real treasure for everyone, regardless of how interested in history you are. Anundshög is Sweden's largest burial mound and is said to be the resting place of King Bröt-Anund although the grave has never been excavated. Alongside the burial mound there are five stone ships from the first millennium AD as well as other graves and a stately rune stone. Anundshög and the surrounding area of Badelunda are full of prehistoric finds and are believed to have been an important centre of power.

Sweden's first action waterpark

Västerås' 100-year-old steam power station, on the shores of Lake Mälaren, is now home to the state-of-the-art eight-storey action waterpark Kokpunkten.

Unlike traditional waterparks, Kokpunkten offers a more actionpacked experience for the entire family. It uses digital projection techniques to provide the visitor with a thrilling visual and physical experience. There's also a modern spa with a beer and wine bar. An experience for the entire family in Västerås – the city where everything is possible!



One of Sweden's most visited museums

If you like red wooden houses and rural idylls then you really must visit Vallby Open Air Museum, which is home to about 40 historical buildings and a living exhibition in the form of animals and plants from





the county of Västmanland.

The area also has a restaurant and café. During the summer the museum comes alive to give you an idea of what life would have been like in a bygone age. So don't be surprised if you come across maids, farmhands and schoolmistresses as you walk around.

Secrets and history

Västerås Cathedral is the third largest cathedral in Sweden.

The cathedral is situated in the centre of Västerås and is well worth a visit. Västerås Cathedral is renowned for its 6 well-preserved altar screens from the 15th and 16th centuries, Sweden's richest collection of epitaphs from its period as a great power and King Erik XIV's marble sarcophagu. Behind the cathedral you'll find Västerås' oldest district "Kyrkbacken" with its charming narrow streets and old houses.



Mälaren promenade

A popular 4 km pedestrian and cycle path runs along the waterfront from Lögastrand to Öster Mälarstrand. Follow the clear signs to get from the station to the Steam Hotel, Poesiparken playground, Kokpunkten action waterpark or the skatepark. For a longer walk, you can carry on through Framnäs and the footbridge at Tegeludden, all the way out to Björnö.




Ångkraftverket

LAKE MÄLAREN

Västerås is a fantastic winter city where you can ice skate, cross-country ski and walk across the frozen Lake Mälaren. All the necessary equipment can be rented. In the summer Västerås gives you the opportunity to enjoy the Swedish nature that attracts visitors from all over the world – you can swim, take a walk or just enjoy the tranquillity.

The M/F Elba hop-on-hop-off ferry is classic and an significant part of the Västerås experience. Västerås guest harbour has also become a hub of activity in the city, with RIB boat trips and Västerås Cable Park, which offers fun for both riders and spectators.
